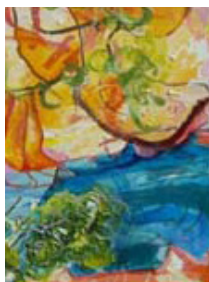


ART SKILLS DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS

The workshops focus on a range of inspiring art techniques and will be facilitated by professional Western Australian artists. Each workshop series is limited to 6 participants (aged 18+), each attending with a support worker, and includes all art materials. 2D MIXED MEDIA with Louise Lodge

Learn and explore a range of two-dimensional mixed-media art techniques including gouache, ink, watercolour paints and pencils, soft pastels and crayons. In the workshops there will be a strong emphasis on self expression.

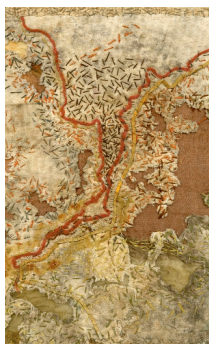
PRINT-MAKING with Sylvia Kennedy

Explore a range of experimental print-making techniques on paper and fabric, including creating relief images on foam and stencilling using found objects and the participants own designs. Participants will produce a number of colour and black-and-white prints as well as a printed bag.

NATURAL DYEING with Trudi Pollard

Learn to use natural dyes made from Western Australian minerals and plants (leaves, nuts, bark, roots etc.) on natural materials including cotton, silk, wool and paper. Participants will also learn a number of shibori techniques, that is methods of creating patterns using dye by folding, clamping and twisting materials. Participants will be encouraged to explore their connection to the environment/place through the use of colours and patterns.

CONTEMPORARY ABORIGINAL ART with Sharyn Egan

Learn to use a variety of art materials including ochres, resins and acrylic paints. Participants will create works with an earth effect, that is aerial views of the earth, expressing Aboriginal culture and identity. (Aboriginal participants only)

CLAY with Joanna Wakefield

Explore the tactile qualities of clay and a range of hand-building techniques including rolling, joining, coiling and making slabs. Participants will also explore the decoration of clay with the use of tools, mark-making, stamps, coils and clay additions. Participants will be encouraged to form shapes with clay to make recognisable figurative and animal forms.
